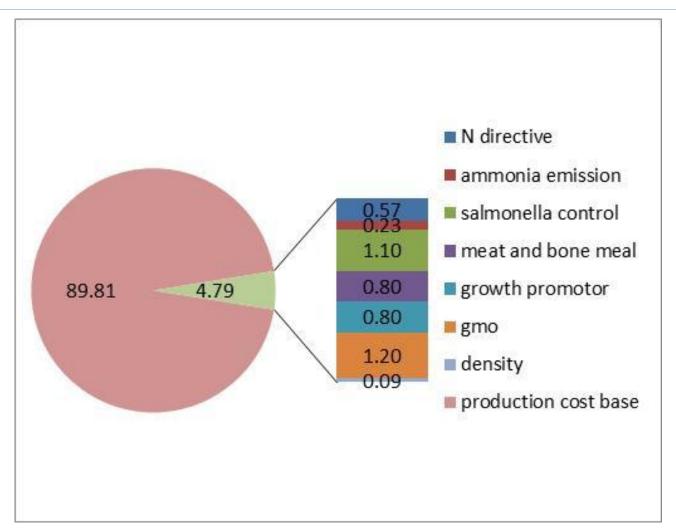

Structure and employment

Number of companies:

- Number of farms: 2,237,000 farms (eurostat, 2010)
- Commercial farms: 19,680 (more than 5000 birds)
- Slaughterhouses: 1970 (eurostat, 2007)

Employment:

- Detailled data of Netherlands, France and Germany
- 23 workers per 1000 ton poultry meat
 - → EU-27 employment of 303,000 workers



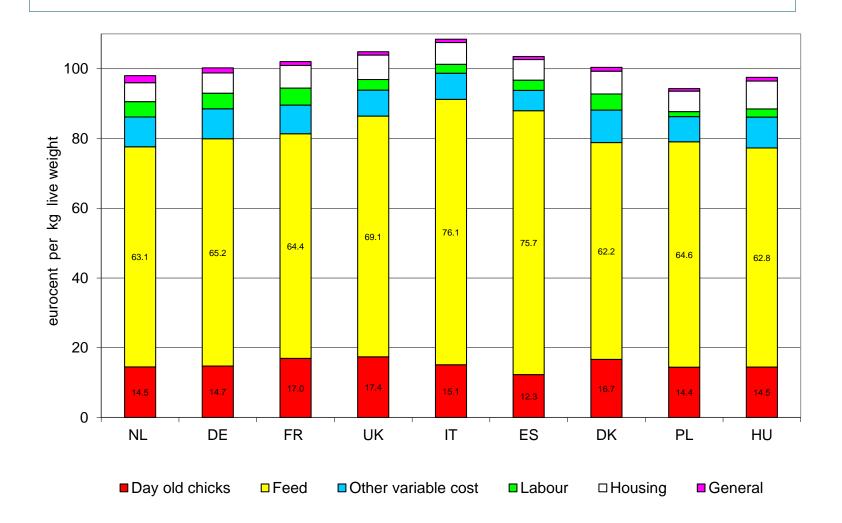
Method production costs broiler meat

- Collecting basic data on production, 2011 / 2013
- Countries in EU: NL, DE, FR, UK, IT, ES, DK, PL, HU
- Countries non-EU: USA, THA, BRA, ARG, RUS, UKR
- NL calculation method
- Focus on:
 - Primary: feed, doc, housing, labour
 - Processing: plant, equipment, labour
 - Transport cost to market



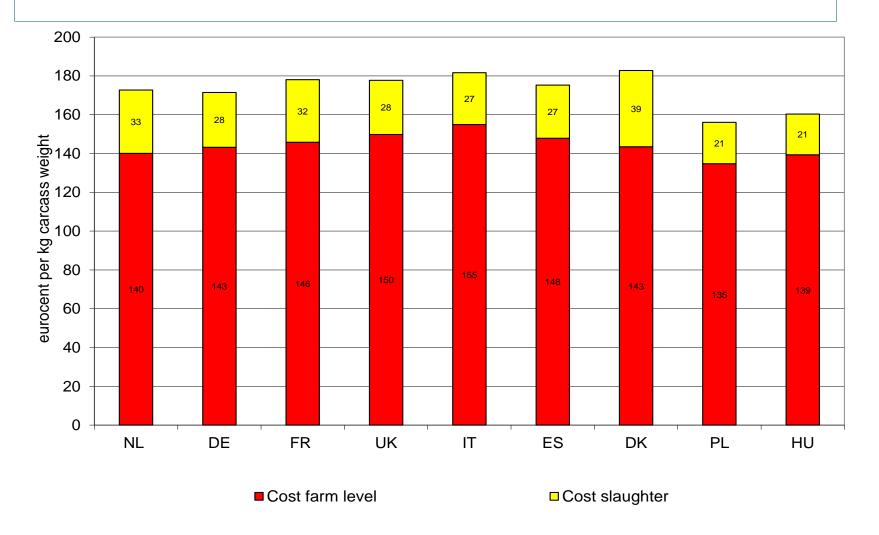


Production costs broilers at farm level **2013** (Euro/kg LW) in EU countries



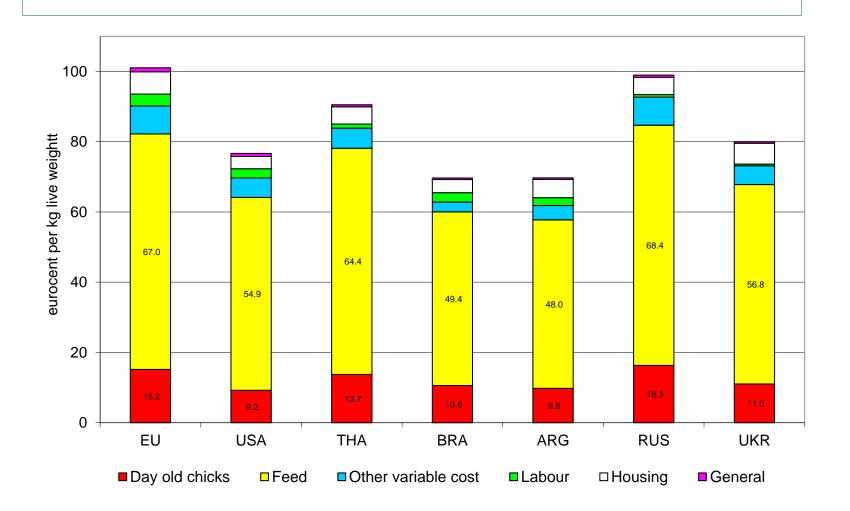


Production costs <u>broiler farm and slaughter</u> **2013** (Euro/kg CW) in EU countries



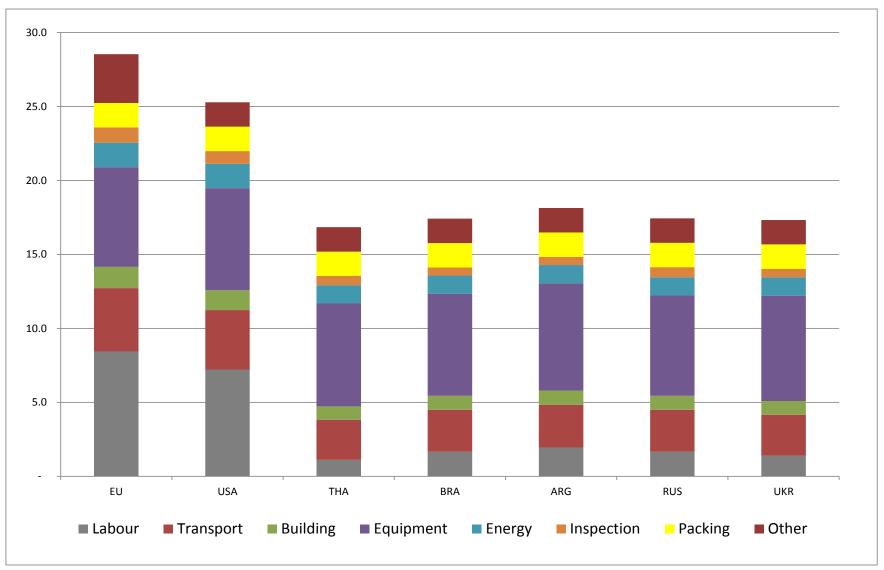


Production costs broilers <u>farm level</u> **2013** (Euro/kg LW) in third countries



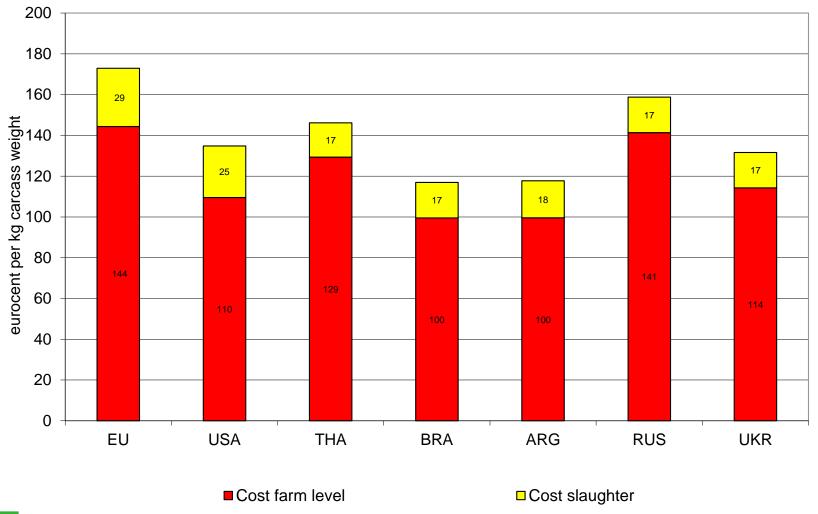


Slaughter costs (Euro/kg CW) in third countries, 2013



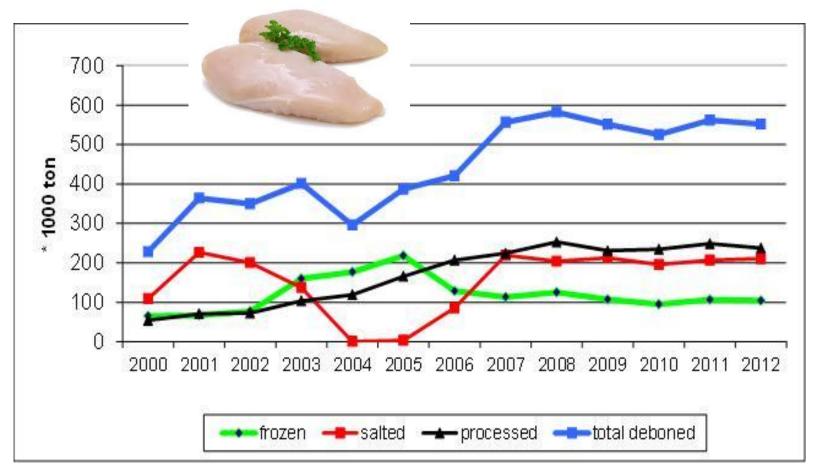

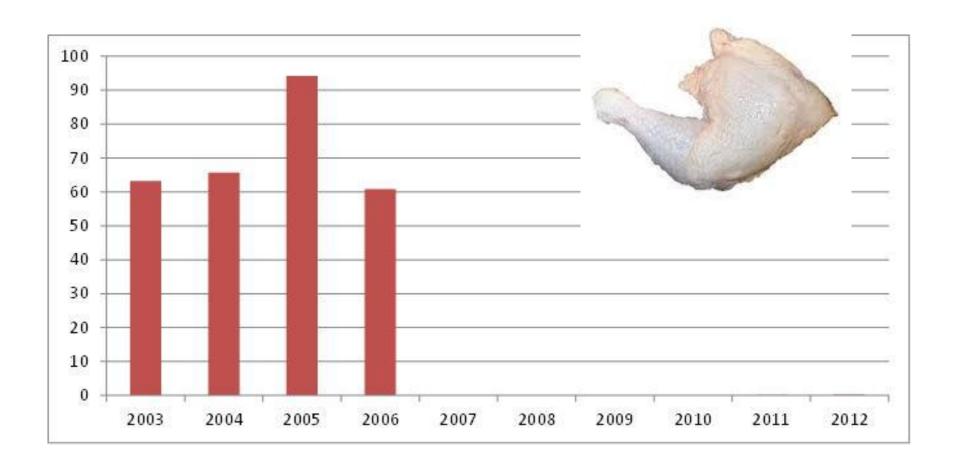
EU Imports third countries (1000 ton) breast fillet

EU Exports:

- Lower value than imports
- Outlet for full valuation of the whole birds
- Whole birds (65%) to Middle East



Scenarios for the future

- Import tariffs on poultry meat. Reduction as a result of
 - WTO agreement
 - Multilateral or bilateral agreements
- Exchange rates
 - large fluctuation.

Scenario examples:

- 50% reduction in import tariff (no additional levy)
- 10% change in exchange rate to Euro





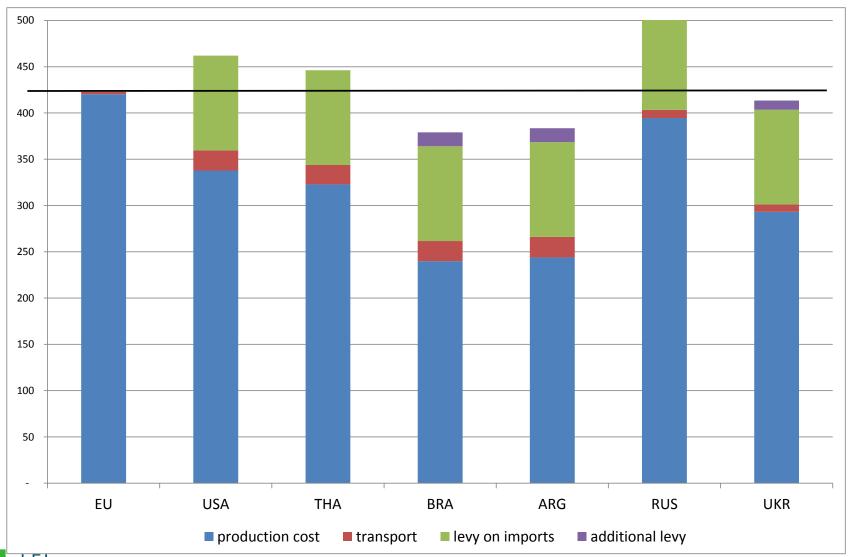
Calculating offer price

- Production cost farm level and slaughter
- Additional:
 - Cut up bird
 - Deboning breast cap
 - Revenue other parts
 - Revenue offal
- → Calculated offer price fillet



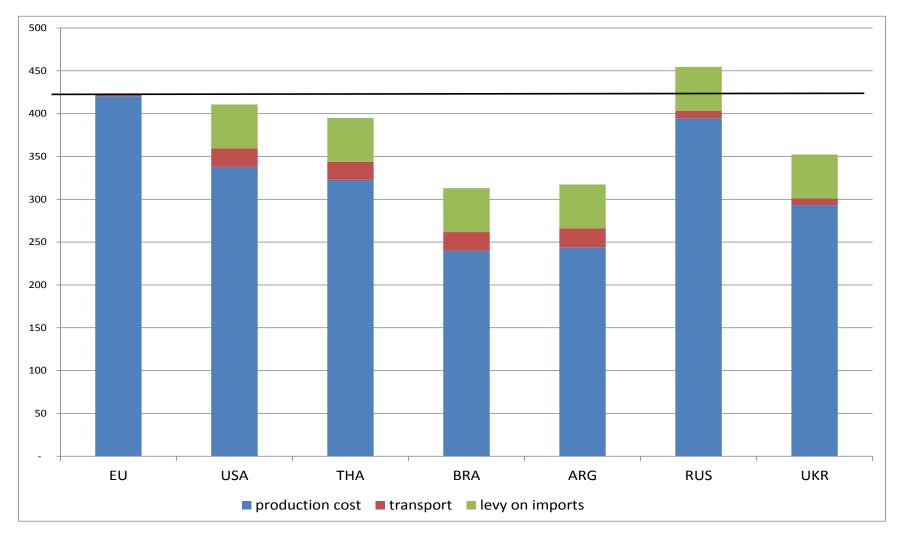


Situation 2013: Offer price breast fillet EU and non EU (E/kg)



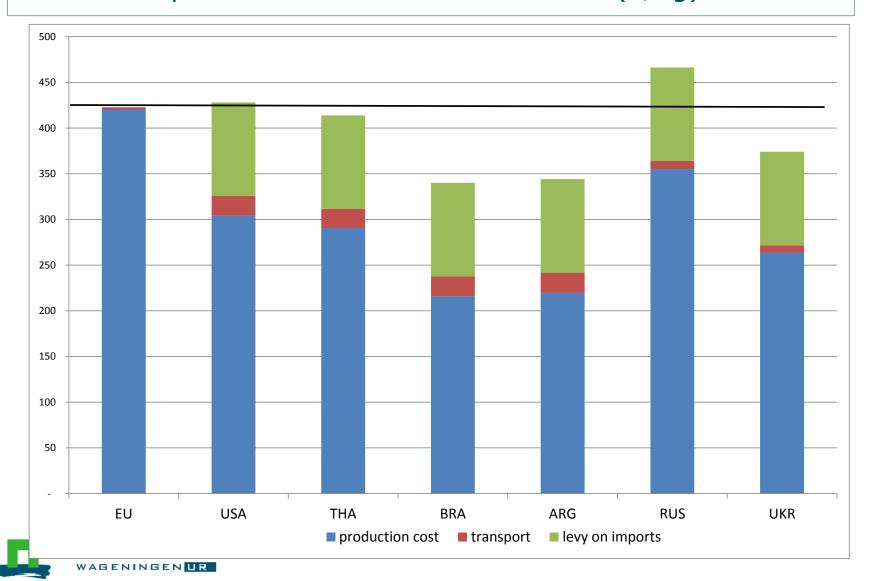


Scenario 1: 50% lower basic levy, no additional levy 2013 Offer price breast fillet EU and non EU (E/kg)

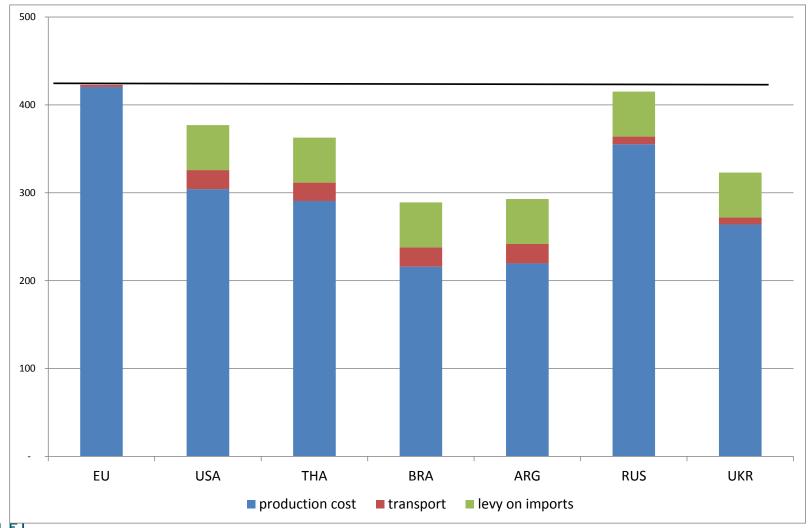




Scenario 2: 10% lower exchange rate to the Euro 2013 Offer price breast fillet EU and non EU (E/kg)

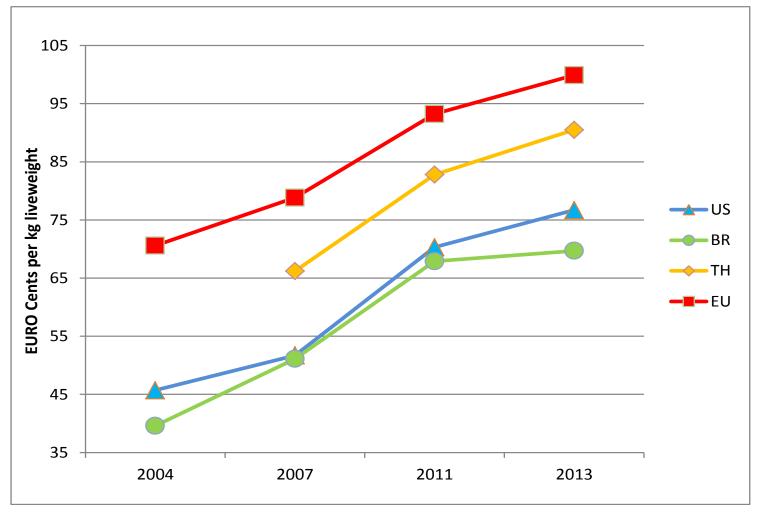


Scenario 3: 50% lower basic levy and 10% lower exchange rate. 2013 Offer price breast fillet EU and non EU (E/kg)





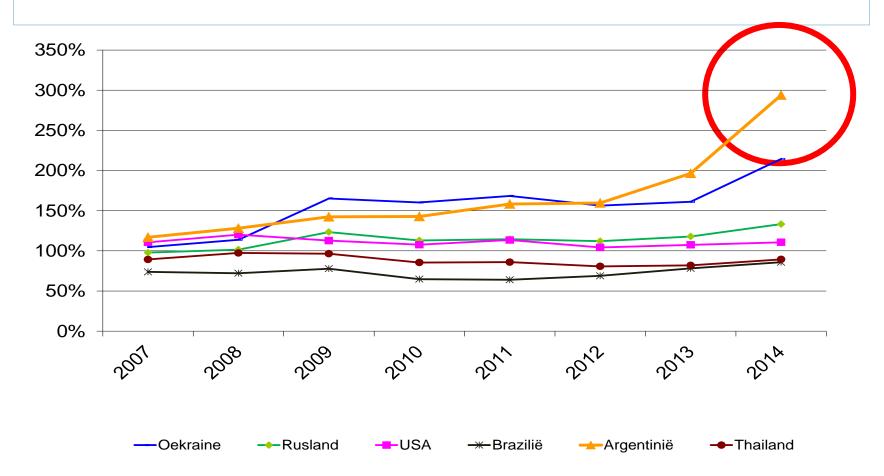
Overview production cost farm level: average EU – third countries in years 2004-2007-2011-2013

Conclusions (1)

- Poultry meat sector is important economic factor in many countries: production value of 32 billion euro in 2012 and more than 300,000 persons employed.
- Many EU regulations on environment, food safety and animal welfare. Some countries with additional national regulations.
- In 2011 estimated costs of EU regulations is 5% of production cost (farm level). More regulations in 'pipeline'
- Third countries: no or very little legislation



Conclusions (2)

- In EU relatively small differences in production costs at farm level (+ or – 5%).
- Third countries have significant lower production costs farm and slaughter:
 - Brazil and Argentina 30%
 - Ukraine and USA 20 to 25%
- Import of high value breast fillet
- Quota and Import levies protect EU from large volumes of imports of poultry meat.



Conclusions (3)

- Scenarios with lower import levies (e.g 50%): lower offer price of breast fillet: clearly below EU level for Brazil, Argentina, Ukraine. Also USA and Thailand.
- Fair competition?: Outside EU in general no or little legislation on topics of public concern in the EU.

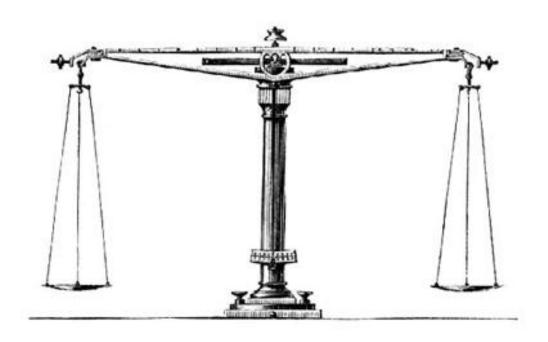
Future perspective:

- Further increase of legislation/ regulations
- Lower import levies or more market access
- → Weaker competitive position for EU poultry meat industry
